NOTES

"Minuet and Dance of the Blessed Spirits" from Orfeo

Based on the ancient Greek myth of Orpheus and Eurydice, Gluck's Orfeo ed Euridice retells the story of a mortal musician who dares to travel into the underworld. With music so powerful it could move even the gods, Orfeo sets out to bring his lost love back from death. The Dance of the Blessed Spirits happens when Orfeo reaches the Elysian Fields — a beautiful, peaceful place where the souls of heroes and the good rest forever. Here, Gluck's music opens up with a calm, dreamlike feeling, using simple, heartfelt melodies to capture the magic of the story. In Victoria Jicha's arrangement, the quiet beauty of this moment still shines through, keeping the spirit of the myth alive.

Syrinx

Debussy's *Syrinx* is based on the Greek myth of Pan and the nymph Syrinx. After trying to escape Pan, Syrinx transforms into reeds, and Pan, heartbroken, uses them to create the first panpipes. This short piece for solo flute feels almost like a conversation — flowing, a little wild, and full of emotion. With just a simple melody, Debussy brings out all the sadness, beauty, and mystery of the story in a way that still feels fresh today.

Six Metamorphosis After Ovid

I. Pan

This movement draws on the myth of Pan, the woodland god, and his pursuit of the nymph Syrinx. When she transforms into reeds to escape him, Pan fashions them into the first panpipes. Britten reflects this story through free, wandering lines that suggest both the wildness of nature and the mournful beauty of Pan's music. The unmeasured rhythm gives the impression of spontaneous playing—lonely, lyrical, and untamed.

The Parting Glass

The Parting Glass is a traditional Irish and Scottish folk song performed between friends and loved ones. When the piece was composed it was typically performed at social gatherings or celebrations when it was time to depart and the party wished to reflect on the events of the evening. It has fallen out of practice to perform it so often, but we wanted to share it with our audience members tonight. We chose this piece to say thank you to those who attended our concert and to say goodbye and thank you to our seniors graduating this spring. We will miss them and look forward to seeing what they do as they enter their new phase of life!
