ABOUT THE ARTIST

Anthony Williams teaches applied trombone, trombone ensemble, azz trombone ensemble, and courses in low brass techniques and ombone literature. His previous teaching appointments include he University of Mary (ND), University of Memphis, and Lemoyne-Owen College. An active clinician, he has worked with middle chool, high school, and college students locally, regionally, ationally and internationally. Dr. Williams maintains a high equency of performing in classical, jazz, and new music settings and has performed with artists and ensembles such as the Nemphis Symphony, Arkansas Symphony, Waterloo-Cedar Falls ymphony, Orchestra Iowa, Dubuque Symphony, Memphis Jazz Drchestra, Jazz Orchestra of the Delta, Ray Charles Orchestra, Dirty Dozen Brass Band, Natalie Cole, Jimmy Dorsey Tribute Orchestra, enny Goodman Orchestra, Slide Hampton, Peter Erskine, Natalie cole, Rufus Reid, Jeff Coffin, and Clark Terry. Williams recently erformed for the second time as lead trombonist on the Mike Valdrop Big Band's 2017 release; "Origins." Other recording rojects include The Mike Waldrop Big Band's debut album; "Time Vithin Itself," Grosso for Trombone and Electronics for Mexican orn composer, Jorge Sosa's album, "Plastic Time," albums by Ryan Middagh, The Dave Lisik Jazz Orchestra, University of Aemphis "Southern Comfort" Jazz Ensemble, and The University of Jorthern Iowa Jazz Band One playing lead trombone.

Dr. Williams earned degrees from the University of Central Arkansas (BM), University of Northern Iowa (MM), and the University of Memphis (DMA).

He is a member of the International Trombone Association, National Association for Music Education, College Music Society, and the Jazz Education Network.
