## ABOUT THE ARTISTS

The Colere Quartet is an award-winning chamber ensemble comprised of saxophonists John Cummins, Elissa Kana, Greg Rife, and Dennis Kwok that presents engaging programs consisting of a wide range of classical and contemporary repertoire. Colere is a Latin word meaning "to cultivate." This name was inspired by the expansive farmland surrounding the University of Iowa, where the quartet was founded in 2017, and by the group's commitment to cultivating musical life in the Midwest and beyond.

As active advocates of music education, Colere loves introducing young musicians to the wonders of chamber music by regularly hosting masterclasses and interactive concert programs at schools throughout the Midwest as they strive to inspire and help cultivate the next generation of enthusiastic musicians and arts advocates.

Honors awarded to Colere include a Gold Medal at the 2020 Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition and First Prize at the 2019 Plowman Chamber Music Competition. Recent highlights include a featured recital on WFMT's Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concert Series, virtual educational outreach programming that reached over 500 students in Indiana and Michigan in the fall of 2020, and performances at the Shockingly Modern Saxophone Festival and at conferences hosted by the North American Saxophone Alliance.
