Camille Saint-Saëns was a major French composer during the Romantic period of music. Two works of his that are very famous include his *Symphony No. 3* and The Carnival of Animals. Cavatine is a very popular trombone solo and Saint-Saëns is arguably the most famous composer to have written for trombone.

Launy Grøndahl was a Danish composer and conductor. From 1925 to 1956, Grøndahl served as the resident conductor of the Danish Symphony Orchestra. His most famous work is his trombone concerto which was written while spending time in Italy. The concerto was premiered in Copenhagen by a trombone soloist named Vilhelm Aarkrogh and the Orchestra of the Casino Theatre.

Giacomo Puccini was an Italian composer known for his operas and arias. *Turandot* was Puccini's last opera and contains the aria entitled, *Nessun Dorma*, which means "None shall sleep". *Nessun Dorma* was made famous years after the opera was written by the famous Italian tenor, Luciano Pavarotti. Pavarotti performed the aria often and it became something of a theme for his performances. This edition was arranged for trombone and piano by Robert Elkjer and was performed by Joseph Alessi on the album entitled, *Return to Sorrento*.

Michael Davis is a professional jazz trombonist and composer. *Mission Red* was commissioned by John Marcellus and includes aspects of classical and jazz music including improvisation.

Johann Sebastian Bach was a German composer and musician during the Baroque period of music. *Contrapunctus IX* is from a collection of fugues entitled *The Art of the Fugue* which was written near the end of Bach's life. This edition was arranged by Glenn Smith who was a professional trombonist and professor of trombone at the University of Michigan.
