**DEANNA LITTLE:** Dr. Deanna Little, professor of flute at Middle Tennessee State University, holds a Bachelor of Music degree in education from the University of Northern Iowa, a Master of Music in flute performance and the Doctor of Music in flute performance and pedagogy from Indiana University. At MTSU, she teaches applied flute, classes in woodwind methods, literature and pedagogy and directs the MTSU Flute Choir.

As an active performer, Little is a member of the Stones River Winds and the Stones River Chamber Players. She is a frequent performer with the Nashville Symphony and is Principal flute of the Murfreesboro Symphony Orchestra. She has also performed with the Nashville Opera, the Nashville Ballet, the Nashville Chamber Orchestra, Huntsville Symphony (AL), Sewanee Symphony Orchestra (TN), and Evansville Philharmonic (IN).

Little has won numerous awards for her flute playing. She was a two-time winner in the National Flute Association's Young Artist Competition as well as the recipient of an award for best performance of a newly commissioned work. She was a winner in the Myrna Brown Competition in Texas and a semi-finalist in the New York Concert Artists Guild Competition.

She has performed as a soloist, master class clinician, chamber musician, and flute ensemble director throughout the United States, Canada, Central and South America, France, Germany, Italy, Norway, Sweden, Finland, Russia and the Netherlands. She was also the 2004 local arrangements coordinator for the NFA Convention in Nashville, TN and is a past-president of the Mid-South Flute Society.

In addition to teaching at MTSU, Little is on the faculty of the Tennessee Governor's School for the Arts and has also taught on the faculty at Drake University and the University of the South at Sewanee. She released her first solo CD, *Diamonds Uncovered*, in 2009. Deanna Little is an Altus Artist, her primary instructors include Angeleita Floyd, Trevor Wye, Peter Lloyd, Kate Lukas and James Scott.

**WINDELL LITTLE:** Since 1990 Windell Little has had a private piano studio in Murfreesboro Tennessee. During that same time he has served as organist/music director at various churches and is currently Organist/Pianist at St. Marks United Methodist Church in Murfreesboro. Little

In addition to teaching and church music Mr. Little is adjunct faculty pianist at Middle Tennessee State University. He continues to maintain an active collaborative playing schedule with instrumentalists and vocalist both locally and regionally.

Deanna and Windell have been married for 10 years and have played together for 11. They reside in Murfreesboro, Tennessee and enjoy raising their 10 month old foster baby boy along with their three furry canine children.
