#### Warren T. Goodman

Warren T. Goodman is a physician and pianist, and a graduate from the University of Northern Iowa. He had the privilege of studying piano with Howard Aibel at UNI and later returned to the university to complete his premedical studies. He finds the relationships between music and the science of medicine compelling and symbiotic, appreciating the highly analytical nature of both, yet understanding that each has the capacity to lead to a deeper experience that can be shared with others.

Dr. Goodman enjoys performing regularly with bassoonist, Brisa de Paula, and has also performed in recital with the acclaimed Canadian bassoonist, Christopher Millard. He works at Regions Hospital in St. Paul, MN in the Cancer Center as an Oncodermatologist, and also in the Pathology Department as the Medical Director of Dermatopathology.

### Brisa de Paula

Dr. Brisa de Paula, originally from Brazil, serves as Instructor of Bassoon at the University of Northern Iowa, as second bassoonist with the La Crosse Symphony Orchestra, and as newly appointed teaching artist with IDAGIO Academy. She plays as a substitute bassoonist with various regional orchestras, including the Waterloo-Cedar Falls and the Dubuque Symphony Orchestras and she is a member of the WCFSO Woodwind Quintet for the 2023/24 season. Dr. de Paula is a Sphinx Organization NAAS artist and grant recipient.

An experienced and multifaceted musician, Dr. Brisa de Paula performed extensively in Europe, where she was sought after for consistency, artistry, and dedication, performing regularly with orchestras such as Orchestra del Teatro alla Scala, Deutsche Radio Philharmonie Saarbrücken/Kaiserslautern, Württembergisches Kammerorchester Heilbronn, Badische Staatskapelle Karlsruhe, Bremer Philharmoniker, Aalborg Symphony Orchestra, L'Orchestre de Chambre de Genève, Philharmonie Südwestfalen, Münchner Bach Orchester, among others. She took time away from Europe in 2011 to assist the Orquestra Sinfônica do Estado de São Paulo, the most prestigious orchestra in South America, where she was the acting solo contrabassoonist and second bassoonist. As an avid chamber musician, in 2012 she had the distinction of being invited to participate as a member of the Zermatt Festival-Chamber Music and Academy with the Scharoun Ensemble of the Berliner Philharmoniker in Zermatt. Switzerland. During her residency in Zermatt, she performed more than a dozen concerts alongside members of the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra. She was invited to perform as principal bassoonist with the Sinfónica Azteca 2023 under Paolo Bortolameolli, associate conductor of the LA Philharmonic. In addition to her substantial background in orchestral performance and chamber music, she performs regularly as a recitalist in the United States with pianist and physician Warren T. Goodman. Their live and unedited performances are available on YouTube.

Dr. de Paula has served as Adjunct Instructor of Bassoon at the University of Cincinnati/College-Conservatory of Music, teaching alongside the legendary pedagogue, William Winstead, and as Assistant Professor of Bassoon at Western Illinois University. Throughout her teaching career, Dr. de Paula has given masterclasses at universities across the Midwest, as well as numerous clinics for pre-college students.

She earned a Master's Degree, as well as the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Bassoon Performance with an emphasis in musicology from the University of Cincinnati/College-Conservatory of Music, where she was the Bassoon Teaching Assistant. She also holds an Artist Diploma in Bassoon Performance from the Hochschule für Musik Saar in Saarbrücken, Germany. She is a 2023 Bassoon Fellow of the OAcademy Orchestra Institute under the mentorship of Simon van Holen, solo contrabassoonist with the Concertgebouw Orchestra. Her principal teachers include William Winstead, Gernot Friedrich, and Marc Engelhardt. Her musical training also includes masterclasses with Klaus Thunemann, Georg Klütsch, Helman Jung, Christopher Millard, Daniel Shelley, and Gustavo Nuñez.
