ABOUT THE ARTIST

Dr. Todd Van Kekerix is Assistant Professor of Piano and Piano Pedagogy and Class Piano Coordinator at the University of Houston (UH). Prior to his appointment at UH, he was a graduate teaching assistant at the University of Oklahoma. Other former piano teaching positions include The New School for Music Study in Kingston, NJ (2007-2016) where he was Director of Enrichment Programs and Kean University in Union, NJ (2011-2016). His degrees include a DMA in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from the University of Oklahoma (Dissertation: "The Contributions of Elvina Truman Pearce to Piano Pedagogy"), Artist Certificate and MM in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from Southern Methodist University, and a Bachelor of Arts in Music and Business Administration from Augustana University.

Van Kekerix has given recitals, workshops, and masterclasses for local, national, and international audiences. Internationally, his research on the effects of keyboard music making was presented virtually at the 6th International Conference Association of Music and Medicine (2020). In fall of 2019, he gave recitals and workshops at Zhejiang Conservatory of Music and Shaoxing University in China; and in 2022, he traveled to Canada to give a series of masterclasses and a recital University of Alberta. Nationally, he has presented at The National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy and MTNA National Conference. Lastly, he has been a guest lecturer for numerous state and local music teachers associations and pedagogy of Music, American Music Teacher and Clavier Companion and was recently invited to contribute to Clavier Companion's Inspiring Artistry and From the Artist Bench series.

In 2020, Van Kekerix was awarded a grant by the Cynthia Woods Mitchell Center for the Arts to provide keyboard music-making experiences for long-term caregivers in Houston in collaboration with artist, Marisa Moran Jahn. Other significant awards and honors include The Provost's Certificate of Distinction in Teaching from the University of Oklahoma (2018). While at OU, he was chosen as a soloist for their annual Concerto-Gala Concert, where he performed Rachmaninoff's *Third Piano Concerto: Finale: Alla breve*. Other performance highlights include Weill Recital Hall in Carnegie Hall and the Schloss Esterházy in Eisenstadt, Austria.

During his downtime, Van Kekerix enjoys downhill skiing, traveling, and exploring new gastronomic delights and cookbooks.
