Position Title: Graduate Assistant in Athletic Bands

Reports to: Director and Associate Director, School of Music, and Director of Marching Bands

Terms of Employment:

- For the fall semester: 20 hours per week, beginning **the first day of the semester** and ending **the last day of finals week**. Does not include the week of Thanksgiving Break.
- For the spring semester: 20 hours per week, beginning **the first day of the semester** and ending **the last day of finals week**. Does not include the week of Spring Break.

Compensation:

- Full assistantship salary is \$5,395.00 per semester. Half assistantships may be awarded.
- Graduate Assistants may qualify for in-state tuition and fees.
- Graduate Assistants receive University holidays and do not work during Thanksgiving Break, Spring Break, or the interims between semesters.
- Graduate Assistants may also apply for tuition scholarships. These scholarships are applied for and awarded separately and are not part of compensation for the Graduate Assistantship.

Position Description:

- The Athletic Band Graduate Assistant is responsible for assisting with the Administration of the UNI Marching Band and Pep Bands. The Graduate Assistant leads Pep Bands at home games and tournaments under the direction of the Director of Marching and Symphonic Bands. In addition, the GA is assigned to instructional and administrative duties with bands and instrumental music courses and ensembles, and additional duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Must be a full-time, degree-seeking student in a UNI School of Music graduate program (M.M. Performance or M.A. Music preferred).
- Must be enrolled in 9 qualifying graduate credit hours.
- Maintain a UNI cumulative graduate GPA of at least 3.00. A newly admitted graduate student must have at least a 3.0 GPA for undergraduate or previous graduate work of at least 8 graded credit hours.
- B.A. or B.M. degree in music required.

- Evidence of excellent performance skills required.
- Teaching experience in applied music, ensemble, or classroom setting preferred.
